

This program investigates for former Dept. of Defense chemicals and explosives at the LOOW

Army Corps has split up the LOOW into 20-some distinct clean-up units.

If the Corps determines no action is required, they may close-out investigation without public notice.

Some of the separate units investigated for chemical and explosives include:

Somerset Group property

- Reportedly closed out absent RAB notification

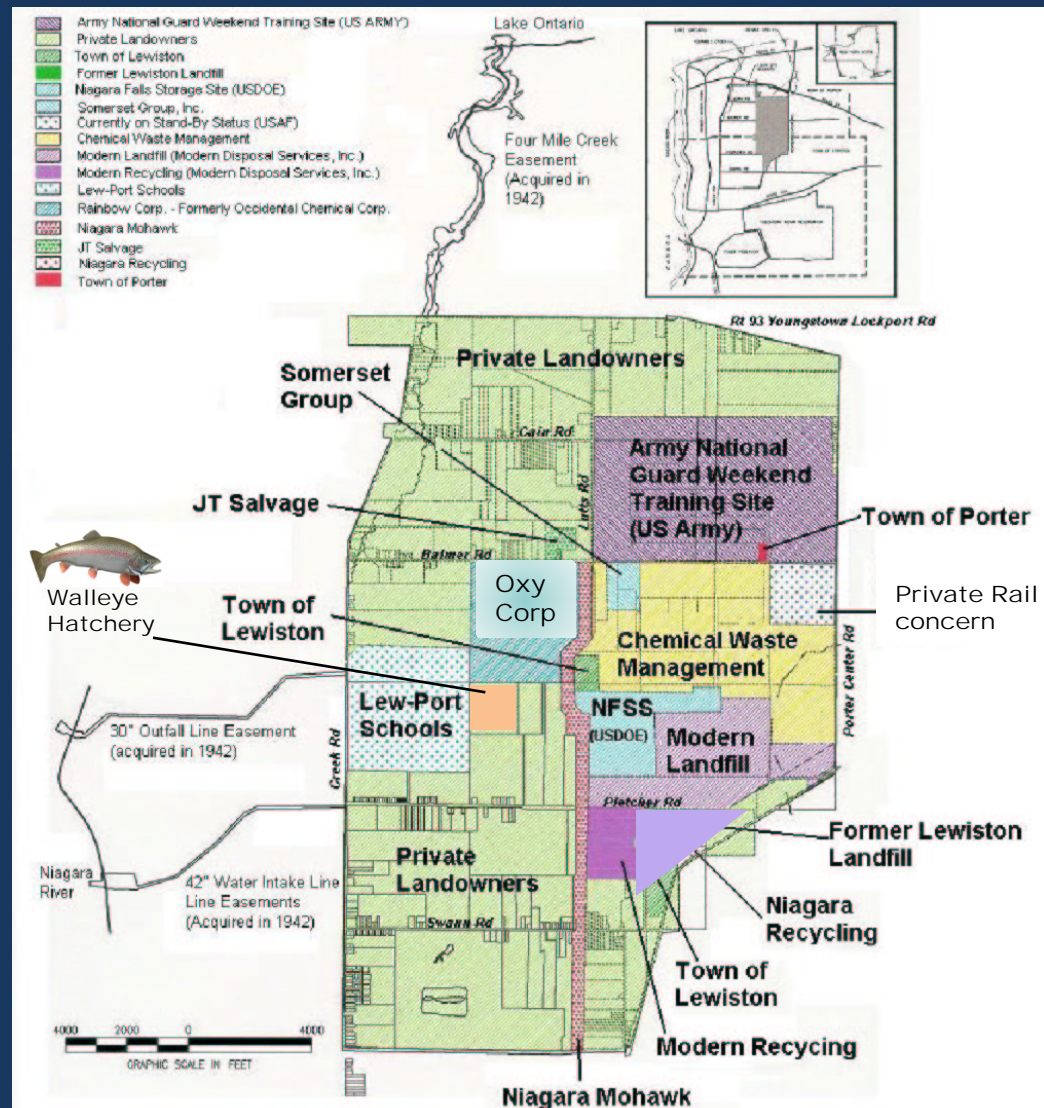
Occidental

- confirmed as former DOD waste disposal
- Corps did not sample all former waste disposal areas

Lew-Port School Property

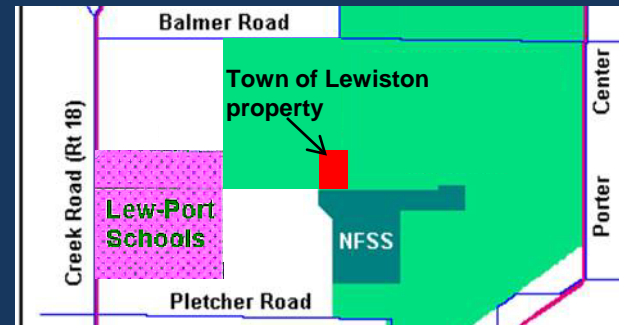
- Corps confirms explosives, lead, PAH's on adjacent, upgradient property, but has not evaluated migration despite the fact that PAH's and trace amounts of explosives were confirmed in ditch on School property

## 1. Abandoned Waste Water Treatment Plant

- TNT Waste Line remediation was carried out by Radian International.
- Radian conducted the TNT Waste Line “remediation” on CWM and failed to recognize several hundred pounds of detonatable crystalline TNT in that waste line. As a result, during pipe removal operations, the TNT was inadvertently scattered on the property surface. Another contractor replaced Radian and conducted another remedial operation on CWM for the Corps.

## 2. Former LOOW Vicinity Shops

- Radioactive material was stored there during Dept. of Energy use.
- However, there has been no radiological investigation because the property has been closed out by the Dept. of Energy.
